Select Social Studies Standards from Local School Division

- Practice citizenship skills and respect for rules and laws while collaborating, compromising and participating in classroom activities.
- Essential Questions: When and how should citizens take action? How do our beliefs shape who we are as citizens?
- Enduring Understandings: People in the United States can contribute to their community and country by being citizens. The people of the United States are diverse but are united by common principles.

Select Literacy Standards from Local School Division

- Participate in collaborative discussions.
- Use language appropriate for context and audience.
- Work respectfully with others in pairs, diverse groups and whole class settings.
- Use vocabulary from other content areas.
- Apply knowledge of the composing domain: central idea, organization, unity and elaboration.
- Engage in writing as a process.
- Apply knowledge of the written expression: word choice and specific vocabulary.

Select SEL Standards

Drawn from the <u>Virginia Social Emotional Guidance Standards</u> and with guidance from Collaborative for Academic, Social and Emotional Learning (<u>CASEL</u>) definition:
