Day #1 - book introduction + read aloud + predetermined comprehension questions and discussion Day #2 - re-read + vocabulary (set A) → guided whole group retell (with props) Day #3 - picture walk retell + introduction to book-based play invitations → play time Day #4 - re-read + vocabulary (set B) → play time + guided play groups Day #5 - read aloud video + characters and setting → play time + guided play groups Day #6 - re-read + problem and solution → play time + guided play groups Day #7 - picture walk retell + author / illustrator → play time + guided play groups Day #8 - read aloud video + purpose of the book (genre) → play time + guided play groups Day #9 - re-read + text-to-self connections → play time + guided play groups Day #9 - re-read + text-to-self connections → play time + guided play groups

As an extension, if there are different versions of the story, you might consider reading those other books as well. Then, facilitate discussions to help your students make text-to-text comparisons.



- visual cards (that include the word, real-life photo, kid-friendly definition, & example sentence)
- gestures (ie: sign language or TPR total physical response)
- discussion (invite students to share what they might already know about a word)
- realia (ie: real-life stick, straw, and brick when reading The Three Little Pigs)
- photo slide deck (ie: what a mole, badger, hedgehog, etc looks like in real life)
- life experiences (ie: volunteer visitor models knitting to reinforce the target word, "knit")
- videos (ie: show an animal digging a home to demonstrate the target word, "burrow")



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
